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THINK OPPORTUNITIES!

- As you await your GCE O-Level results, there are 3 possibilities:
 - You are happy that your results meet your expectations,
 - You are overjoyed that your results exceed your expectations, or
 - You are worried/upset because your results fall short of your expectations.

Remember that **everyone's learning journey is different**
but **we can each have a fulfilling outcome!**

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Managing Your Emotions and Making Your Decisions

When you receive your results, you may feel overwhelmed by emotions. Managing these emotions well will allow you to stay calm and make rational decisions.



STOP

Stop any unhelpful thoughts or actions that would make you more upset. Inhale deeply and exhale slowly using 10 counts as you relax your muscles. Acknowledge your emotions.

THINK

Think through the different options that are available for you. Keep things in perspective. Remember that O-Level is just one part of your life journey and not the destination.

DO

Approach a trusted adult and seek his/her help. Have a conversation with this person about what would be best for you. Make a decision based on your options and take action.




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Reaching out for help is a sign of strength, not weakness.

If you have any concerns or are not coping, do reach out to someone you trust and speak with them. It could be a parent/guardian, teacher, School Counsellor or a friend that you can talk to.



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Having difficult emotions during a stressful and uncertain period is normal.

Keep a lookout for some of these signs in your peers or yourself.

- D** Deliberately avoiding others
- I** Increased irritability, restlessness, agitation, stress and anxiety
- S** Sending or posting moody messages on social media
- T** Talking about death or dying
- R** Reacting differently or gradually losing interest in things they used to like
- E** Eating more than usual or having a much reduced appetite
- S** Sleep pattern changes with difficulty falling asleep or oversleeping
- S** Slowing down of energy levels

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Supporting Your Friend

We may each experience different emotions upon receiving the results. You can share your friends' joy by congratulating them or give words of encouragement to friends who may be disappointed with their results.



Keep a lookout for your friends in distress.
You can support them in the following ways:

Calm them down

“Are you ok? Calm down, take a few deep breaths.”

Hear them out

“I am here to listen to you.” or “I am here for you.”

Empathise with them

“It sounds like you are disappointed.” or “It seems like this is a difficult time for you.”

Encourage seeking help

“Thanks for sharing. Why don't we speak with a trusted adult who can help?”


Refer your friend to a trusted adult

“Let's talk to our teacher or our School Counsellor so they can better support you. Do share your feelings with your parents/guardians too. Would you like me to accompany you?”

 - *The wrong Certificate must also be submitted*



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

 4. You may also use your Singpass to access the JAE-IS

- ❖ Refer to **Guide to JAE Internet System** (JAE Booklet pages 81–91) for a detailed Step-by Step guide to complete and submit the online registration and to check your posting result
- ❖ Print the Verification Slip as evidence of your Registration

Direct School Admission - JC

Students who had accepted offers through 2021 DSA-JC exercise and have met eligibility criteria for admission based on GCE O-Level Exam results

- Report to chosen JC
- Not eligible for JAE registration

Students who did not meet the JC admission criteria may take part in the JAE

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EARLY ADMISSIONS EXERCISE – Polytechnics (EAE)

Early Admissions Exercise - Polytechnics

Students who had earlier accepted **conditional** offers to a polytechnic course through the EAE (Polytechnics) in 2021 and have offers confirmed based on net ELR2B2 score of 26 points or better and met minimum entry requirements for the respective polytechnic course

- Report to chosen Poly and course
- Not eligible for JAE registration

Students who did not meet the above criteria will get another chance to apply to the polytechnic via the JAE



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Early Admissions Exercise - ITE

Students who had accepted **conditional** offers to an ITE course through the ITE EAE in 2021 and have their offers confirmed based on their GCE O-Level examination results and met the subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements for the course.

- Report to chosen ITE and course
- Not eligible for JAE registration

FOUNDATION PROGRAMME (PFP)
(2021 4/5 & 4/6)**

Polytechnic Foundation Programme

Eligibility criteria:-

- Sat for N and O-Level subjects in 2021
- Use N-Level Exam results and O-Level Exam results (the better grade) for application
- **ELMAB3 aggregate not exceeding 12 points or better (excludes CCA bonus points, which will be taken into account during the posting exercise)**



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Polytechnic Foundation Programme

Eligibility criteria:-

(Group 1 courses)

- EL and Math \leq grade 3
- 1 relevant subject : Science/F&N/D&T \leq grade 3
- 2 Best subjects \leq grade 3

(Group 2 courses)

- EL \leq grade 2
- Math \leq grade 3
- 1 relevant subject : POA/Hum/Art \leq grade 3
- 2 Best subjects \leq grade 3


