Dear Parent/Guardian,

I hope that the June holidays have provided your family with opportunities for rest, rejuvenation and quality time together. We are delighted to welcome your child/ward back to school on Monday, 29 June, and look forward to partnering you in another rewarding semester of learning and development.

Reflections and Highlights from Term 2

As we begin Term 3, we look back on a vibrant and rewarding Term 2, filled with opportunities for our Bedok Viewans to learn, lead and flourish. A key highlight was our Awards Day in April, where we celebrated the achievements, growth and resilience of our students across academic, leadership and character domains, while also witnessing the meaningful leadership succession that reflects the strength of our student leadership culture. These milestones remind us that every Bedok Viewan's success is made possible through the collective support of the school and home.

We were also proud to celebrate our alumni who continue to strive and shine beyond our school, achieving excellence in academics, leadership and service while embodying our vision of being "Learners who Learn for Life, Leaders who Light the Way." Their accomplishments are a testament to the strong foundation built at Bedok View and serve as an inspiration to our current students. We thank our parents and alumni for their continued partnership through initiatives such as the International Friendship Day activities booth, the 2.4km Run & Lunch with Parents and Alumni, and the Parent-Child Bonding & Learning Journey to the Singapore Poon Yue Association on 30 May. Together, these experiences have strengthened our BV family and enriched learning beyond the classroom.

We look forward to building on this momentum in Term 3, beginning with our annual F.A.M.E. (Festival of Arts, Movement and Entrepreneurship) on 6 August and will share more details nearer the date.

School Improvement Works

Several school improvement projects are currently taking place. These works form part of the school's ongoing efforts to provide our students with a safe, conducive and future-ready learning environment, while also improving the overall functionality, accessibility and safety of our school facilities.

1. Classroom LED Lighting and DC Ceiling Fan Replacement

The school's LED lighting and Direct Current (DC) ceiling fan replacement works are in the final stages of completion. Minor rectification, replacement and testing works will continue during the first week of Term 3. These enhancements are intended to provide students and staff with a more comfortable, well-lit and conducive teaching and learning environment.

2. Parade Square Resurfacing Works

Resurfacing works at the parade square began during the June school holidays and are progressing well. These works are being carried out to improve the condition of the flooring surface and to provide a safer environment for students and staff during assemblies, activities and daily movement around the school. A renewed and even surface will better support students' learning, play and school activities, while reducing potential safety concerns arising from wear and tear such as cracks or uneven flooring.

3. Installation of Classroom Security Cameras

The installation of security cameras in classrooms is being carried out to further strengthen the safety and security of students, staff and school property. This is part of the school's ongoing efforts to enhance safety measures and support a secure school environment for all.

4. Science Laboratory Upgrading Works

Upgrading works for the school's Science laboratories will commence when school reopens in Term 3. These works will be carried out in phases, with the first phase involving 2 of the school's 6 Science laboratories. This upgrading project is part of the school's continued effort to refresh and improve learning spaces so that they remain relevant, functional and supportive of quality teaching and learning. The enhanced laboratories will provide a more conducive environment for students to engage in practical lessons and scientific inquiry. Parents can rest assured that these works are scheduled in such a way to avoid any impact on the conduct of the GCE examinations.

5. Upcoming NFS Laboratory and Lift Installation Works

In the second half of Term 3, the school also expects the following works to commence:

- upgrading works for the Nutrition and Food Science (NFS) laboratory; and
- installation of 2 lifts, located at Block E and the Indoor Sports Hall (ISH).

These projects are part of the school's longer-term infrastructure improvement plans to enhance both learning spaces and accessibility within the school.

External Works Affecting Access to School

At the same time, there is also external work taking place outside the school that will temporarily affect access into the school compound.

The Land Transport Authority (LTA) is currently carrying out works for the Round Island Cycling Path, including the widening of the footpath outside the school fence line. As these works involve intensive ground operations near the school frontage, access into the school compound will be temporarily affected.

Temporary Pick-Up and Drop-Off Arrangements

From 25 June 2026 to about 20 July 2026, the school foyer pick-up and drop-off point will be unavailable.

During this period:

- Vehicle access into the school compound for pick-up and drop-off will be suspended
- Only one gate will remain in operation for school staff and emergency access, with traffic managed by a traffic warden.
- **Parents who need to drop off or pick up their children should do so at the open carpark behind the school near Block 53.**
- The back gate will be opened in the morning for student reporting until 7.45 a.m.
- The back gate will open again from 1.15 p.m. onwards for student dismissal and pick-up.

Parents are strongly reminded not to stop, wait or drop off students along the main road outside the school, as works are currently ongoing in the area and doing so may pose safety risks and cause traffic obstruction. Barring unforeseen delays, normal vehicle access into the school compound is expected to resume from 20 July 2026.

Safety and Learning Remain Our Priorities

Students will also be reminded to remain alert when moving around areas affected by works, and to use only designated access routes and exercise caution when entering and leaving the school premises. We would appreciate parents' support in reinforcing these safety reminders with your child/ward, especially during this period of ongoing school and external improvement works.

Please be assured that the safety, well-being and learning of our students remain the school's top priorities. We seek your support and understanding as the school works closely with the Ministry of Education (MOE), relevant agencies and contractors to ensure that all works are carried out safely and with minimal disruption to student learning.

Looking Ahead for Term 3

Term 3 promises to be an exciting and purposeful term for our Bedok Viewans. Beyond the classroom, students will have opportunities to develop their character, strengthen friendships, and showcase their talents through a range of school experiences. Key highlights include our annual F.A.M.E. as well as our National Day celebrations, which provide meaningful opportunities to reflect on Singapore's journey and our role as active citizens.

As students prepare for the academic demands of the second semester, we encourage them to embrace challenges with confidence, persevere in their pursuits and continue striving for personal excellence.
